The program aimed to support the approved City Ordinance NO. 248-2022 also known as the "Bacoor Emergency Response Training Ordinance" and to intensify the practice of Malasakit Sa Bawat Residente of Mayor Strike Revilla.

DOST, DA-PRDP, LGU-Tanauan inaugurate mango, calamansi processing facility for Batangas City farmer coop

The Department of Science and Technology (DOST)-CALABARZON together with the Department of Agriculture-Philippine Rural Development Project (DA-PRDP) and the Local Government Unit of Tanauan (LGU-Tanauan) inaugurated the mango and calamansi processing facility for Magsasakang Tanaueno Agricultural Marketing Cooperative (MTAMC) located at Brgy. Janopol Oriental, Tanauan City, Batangas, Feb. 21.



The facility was intended for the production of mango and calamansi-based ready-to-drink juice drink, concentrate, and puree. The processing equipment needed during production, such as double-jacketed kettle, semi-automatic filling and capping machines, and stainless steel tables, was funded by DOST-CALABARZON under the Grants-in-Aid (GIA) program. The product formulation and processes, on the other hand, were

technologies developed by the DOST-Industrial Technology Development Institute (ITDI).

DA-PRDP and LGU-Tanauan funded the construction of the processing facility, including the provision of key infrastructure, facilities, technology, and information to raise the income, productivity, and competitiveness of MTAMC and its members.

As an agricultural cooperative, MTAMC has long been engaged in

mango and calamansi production since its formation. They ventured into post-harvest processing as a value addition to their produce and to utilize their supply surplus during peak season. In 2020, members of the cooperative were capacitated on mango and calamansi-based products processing through a training provided by DOST-Batangas and DOST-ITDI. The following year, the cooperative received a GIA project



entitled "Science and Technology-Based Support Intervention for the Establishment of the Mango and Calamansi-based Products Processing Enterprise of Magsasakang Tanaueno Agricultural Marketing Cooperative in Tanauan City, Batangas." The project provided MTAMC with S&T-based support interventions that helped them establish their mango and calamansi-based products processing enterprise.

DOST-Batangas has also conducted a technical consultation with an expert from the Institute of Food Science and Technology (IFST) of the University of the Philippines Los Baños (UPLB) last October 25-26, 2022, to improve the production mechanism of the cooperative using DOST-provided processing equipment. Assistance on packaging and labelling design development was also provided by DOST.

To ensure the

sustainability of their enterprise, all 75 farmer-members of the cooperative from the different barangays in Tanauan City have already planted mango and calamansi trees, which are expected to give them a 50% increase in production compared to their existing harvest rate. Meanwhile, Yazaki Torres Manufacturing Inc. (YTMI) has already committed to market a portion of the cooperative's processed products in their canteen and commissary.

Lhissa Malabanan, Tanauan City Administrator, Mr. Wilfredo P. Ablao, Sangguniang Panglunsod Members, DOST-Batangas Provincial Director, Ms. Felina C. Malabanan, representatives from DOST-ITDI, and MTAMC Chairperson, Hon. Maricar E. Maranan.

A technology clinic with Ms. Michelle Evaristo of DOST-ITDI was also conducted after the inauguration ceremony to check the cooperative's compliance with standards.

Charter change not a priority, says PBBM; Congress action on vital legislations expected

The Constitution of the Philippines, ratified by plebiscite on Feb. 2, 1987, has been in force for 36 years, the longest period of uninterrupted democratic governance in the history of the Republic. President Ferdinand Marcos, Jr. has declared that changing the Constitution "is not a priority," pointing out that "there are so many other things that we need to do first." This comes as no surprise. Constitutional change has never been in the forefront of the President's agenda since he took office on June 30, 2022. "We can attain our goals under the 1987 Constitution," the President added.

Advocates of charter change in Congress expressed both respect and disagreement. Rep. Rufus Rodriguez, who has been presiding over hearings in the House of Representatives, said that while the chamber acknowledges the President's view, it reserves the right to pursue its own directions. His Senate counterpart, Sen. Robin Padilla, was emphatic in asserting that amendments to the constitution were necessary to remove institutional roadblocks to liberalizing the economy and incentivizing foreign investors' participation.

Other senators have observed that charter amendments have been rendered unnecessary by the recent enactment of new laws that have liberalized foreigners participation in the economy through the Public Service Act, Retail Trade Liberalization Act and Foreign Investments Act.

Advocates of constitutional amendments have taken different pathways.

In the Duterte administration, a study group headed by former Chief Justice Reynato Puno proposed the adoption of a federal form of government. This proposal was stymied by the Mandanas-Garcia ruling of the Supreme Court that increased the share of local government units (LGUs) in the internal revenue allocation (IRA) of taxes collected.

Charter change was not proposed in Congress during the administration of President Benigno S. Aquino III from 2010 to 2016.



During the administration of President Gloria Macapagal Arroyo, the Supreme Court rejected the petition of Sigaw ng Bayan in 2009, declaring that the petition was defective because the proponents did not show the people the full text of the proposed amendments.

In 1997, during the administration of President Fidel V. Ramos, the Supreme Court ruled against the petition of the People's Initiative for Reform Modernization and Action (PIRMA) that initiated a signature campaign for amending the Constitution, including a shift to parliamentary government and the lifting of term limits of elected officials, including the President. According to the Supreme Court, there was no enabling law for the conduct of the people's initiative, and that the group's petition was defective.

Instead of pursuing their agenda for charter change, legislators may wish to focus on the President's priority bills that are deemed essential in pursuing his 8-point socioeconomic development agenda. Most urgent among these are: the Fiscal Year 2023 General Appropriations Bill, Amendments to Republic Act (RA) No. 11709 (AFP Professionalism), Maharlika Investment Fund, the Mandatory Reserve Officers' Training Corps (ROTC) and National Service Training Program; the proposed Tax Package 3 or Real Property Valuation and Assessment Reform Act; the proposed Tax Package 4 or Passive Income and Financial Intermediary Taxation Act (PIFITA); and the Government Financial Institutions Unified Initiatives to Distressed Enterprises for Economic Recovery (GUIDE) bill.

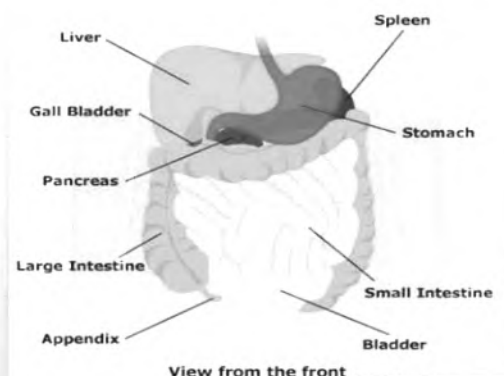

Pope Francis on Ash Wednesday: Free yourself 'from the dictatorship of full schedules'

VATICAN— Pope Francis said Wednesday that Lent is a good time to examine ourselves in the light of truth, to let go of distractions like overbooked calendars, and to improve our relationships with God and others.

"Let us set out on the path of fasting and use these 40 days to take stock of ourselves, to free ourselves from the dictatorship of full schedules, crowded agendas, and superficial needs, and choose the things that truly matter," the pope said on Ash Wednesday, Feb. 22.

"This," he said, "is the favorable time to be converted, to stop looking at ourselves and to start looking into ourselves."

Pope Francis marked the start of the season of Lent, the penitential period before Easter, with Mass at the Basilica of Santa Sabina on Rome's Aventine Hill.

Unlike years prior, Francis did not take part in a penitential procession from the nearby Church of St. Anselm before the Mass. The pope entered Santa Sabina in a wheelchair, which he has used regularly for almost one year since developing a problem with a ligament in his knee.

Cardinals, bishops, priests, the Benedictine monks of St. Anselm, the Dominican friars of Santa Sabina, and laypeople took part in the procession, which began with a brief moment of prayer at St. Anselm church. Catholics inside and outside the church sang the Litany of the Saints as the proces-

sion prayerfully walked the roughly 1,000 feet between the two churches.

Pope Francis said at Mass that we should ask ourselves: "How many distractions and trifles distract us from the things that really count? How often do we get caught up in our own wants and needs, lose sight of the heart of the matter, and fail to embrace the true meaning of our lives in this world?"

"Lent is a time of truth, a time to drop the masks we put on each day to appear perfect in the eyes of the world. Lent is a time, as Jesus said in the Gospel, to reject lies and hypocrisy: not those of others, but of ourselves. Look them in the face and grapple [with them]," he said.

The Mass marked Pope Francis' first time returning to the fifth-century Roman Basilica of Santa Sabina since February 2020.

In 2021, Francis celebrated the Ash Wednesday Mass for a small group of people in St. Peter's Basilica because of the COVID-19 pandemic. In 2022, Cardinal Pietro Parolin celebrated the Mass in place of Francis, whose knee problem had worsened in that period.

The Ash Wednesday custom of the pope visit-

ing the Church of St. Anselm before walking in procession to the Basilica of Santa Sabina for Mass was started in 1961 by St. John XXIII.

The Basilica of Santa Sabina is the mother church of the Dominicans and the first of the Lenten station churches. It is also Rome's oldest church to still have its original architecture. The basilica's large wooden door, which dates to the fifth century, has the oldest known depiction of the Crucifixion.

"Lent, then," Pope Francis said in his homily, "is a season of grace when we can rebuild our relationship with God and with others, opening our hearts in the silence of prayer and emerging from the fortress of our self-sufficiency."

"Lent is the favorable time when we can break the chains of our individualism and rediscover, through encounter and listening ? not solitude but through encounter and listening ? our companions along the journey of each day. And to learn once more to love them as brothers and sisters."

Quoting from the 2006 Ash Wednesday homily of his predecessor, Pope Benedict XVI, Francis said: "Jesus gives 'advice that still retains its salutary value for us: external ges-

tures must always be matched by a sincere heart and consistent behavior. Indeed, the inspired author wonders, what use is it to tear our garments if our hearts remain distant from the Lord, that is, from goodness and justice?"

Pope Francis said Wednesday that there are many times our gestures and rituals do not reflect life and truth.

"Perhaps we perform them only to gain the admiration or esteem of others many times," he said.

"Let us remember this: in our personal life, as in the life of the Church, outward displays, human judgments, and the world's approval count for nothing; the only thing that truly matters is the truth and love that God himself sees."

He reflected on the Church's call to strengthen one's commitment to prayer, almsgiving, and fasting during the approximately 40 days of Lent.

"Let us set out on the path of charity," he said. "We have been given 40 days, a 'favorable time' to remind ourselves that the world is bigger than our narrow personal needs and to rediscover the joy, not of accumulating material goods, but of caring for those who are poor and afflicted." Bishop calls for community effort to address bullying

It takes a community effort to stop bullying, including parents and teachers, an official of the Catholic Bishops' Conference of the Philippines said.

Bishop Rex Andrew Alarcon, chairman of the CBCP Episcopal Commission on Youth (ECY), said that without the community bullying is hard to stop.

"The better solution is not simply reporting but building and promoting a safe culture and environment especially for the young and vulnerable," said Alarcon, who is also the bishop of Daet diocese.

"We call on everyone, as we commit ourselves, to raise awareness and promote a culture of safety, of peace and solidarity. This is a call to go back to the family, the school and our small communities," he said.

The bishop made the statement after a recent senate hearing revealed that the country is the most problematic in the world for bullying among over 70 countries.

Citing a report of the Program for International Student Assessment, Senator Sherwin Gatchalian said that seven out of 10 students in Philippine public schools have suffered bullying.

The senator, who

chairs the Senate committee on basic education, stressed the figure accounts to about 17.5 million students that have been bullied across the country.

Gatchalian also said the data were consistent with the World Health Organization (WHO) report, which showed that 40.6 percent of children aged 13 to 17 have experienced bullying in various forms.

Bishop Alarcon said that they are saddened by the increase of bullying incidents in our country, but again asserted that "it is not only an educational problem." "It should be a concern for all," he said.

"We are sorry for the victims of bullying. Let us strive to end the cycle of bullying where it exists, for we are capable of kindness, trust and love," he added.

"May our faith in a loving God lead us to work for a more humane society and continue to deepen the bonds of our common humanity as we foster respect for fellow human beings and for all creation," Alarcon also said.

and use these 40 days to restore God's primacy in our lives and to dialogue with him from the heart, and not only in spare moments," he continued.

"Let us not neglect the grace of this holy season but fix our gaze on the

cross and set out, responding generously to the powerful promptings of Lent," he said. "At the end of the journey, we will encounter with greater joy the Lord of life ? we will encounter him ? who alone can raise us up from our ashes."

In PSU-Urdaneta, OIC-RD Tabaog and Dr. Ganal dropped by the soon-to-be-opened Solid Freeform Fabrication Research Laboratory (SoFFReL), a 3D printing facility. Also, they provided novel ideas and suggestions to improve the Sea Salt Center proposal research and development projects.

PSU President Elbert Galas welcomed DOST officials as a courtesy to the DOST-I OIC over lunch with representatives from PSU and

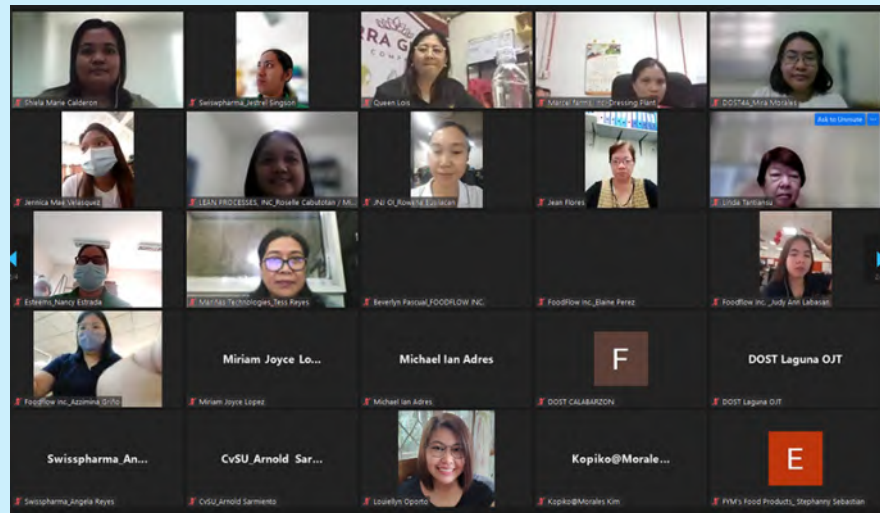
knowledge to become more competitive in domestic and international markets.
