PMCJ to World Bank: Stop Profiting from the Climate Crisis, Provide Reparations for the Harm You Have Caused!

Marking the seventh year of the Philippine Movement for Climate Justice (PMCJ)'s complaint against World Bank (WB)'s and its private sector arm, International Finance Corporation (IFC), the WB's deadly carbon footprint on the harm it has caused continues as communities suffer the coal impacts. The country is being ravaged by climate impacts— the most recent is Typhoon Kristine that killed more than 20, and affected at least 2 million people in 12 regions.. The WB faces criminal liability as justice has not been served for the past seven years.

In light of this year's Global Day of Action for Climate Justice, PMCJ, along with other climate justice groups, renews its call for the WB to stop funding and profiting from the climate crisis and end their support for dirty fossil fuel projects, putting to task all subprojects to immediately formulate a managed phaseout plan of all fos-sil fuels. PMCJ demands accountability and reparation for all the people and communities affected by these projects.

Stop 7he Harm, De liver 7he Remedies

On behalf of the people of 19 communities impacted by coal, PMCJ, Inclusive Development International, and Bank Information Center Europe filed a complaint against the IFC in October 2017 for the financial institution's involvement in the country's alarming expansion of coal-fired power plants.

The complaint singledout WB-IFC expanded coal projects in the Philippines by lending hundreds of millions of dollars to a financial intermediary, the Rizal Commercial Banking Corporation (RCBC), which is one of the leading domestic coal financiers in the country. The WB violated their own rules regarding the environmental and social requirements by allowing the construction of 19 coal plants.

Coal-fired power plants contribute to severe air, land, and water pollution; leading to contaminated crops, fruitbearing trees, marine ecosystems; health impacts, such as skin conditions and cardiovascular and respiratory diseases. Communities suffer deaths in the families and many are uprooted with little to no compensation and relocation plans. The community resistance against these harmful projects are met with harassment and

death. The Philippines continues to be one of the deadliest countries for climate and environmental defenders.

The Compliance Advisor Ombudsman (CAO), the independent watchdog of the WB Group, declared in October 2019 that it would investigate IFC in response to the climate complaint, potentially impacting assets in the Philippines totaling at least USD 254 million (PHP 13 billion).

Masinloc Power Plant, GN Power Dinginin, South Luzon Thermal Energy Corporation, San **Buenaventura Coal-Fired** Power Plant, Panay Power Station, Southern Mindanao Coal-Fired Power Plant, Lanao Kauswagan Coal-Fired Power Plant, and the coal-fired power plants in Toledo, Atimonan, Limay, and Malita, were among the 11 out of the 19 projects that were found eligible based on CAO standards.

As the climate crisis escalates, communities carry on with the fight against fossil fuels and push for clean renewables. PMCJ urges a full halt to both indirect and direct financing of fossil fuel projects and calls for a complete exit from coal. The Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change in its AR6 calls for the peak of fossil fuel use by 2025.

Bank on Renewables Last September, a crucial milestone was attained as the province of Albay in the Philippines embarked on a 1250 megawatt renewable energy project valued at Php 84 billion (USD1.5 billion), demonstrating that the province's renewable energy future is no longer a distant goal but a reality. The milestone capped the twoday Renewable Energy and Investment Summit, a collaboration between the provincial government and PMCJ.

In order to meet the

region's increasing energy needs and establish Albay as a pioneer of the Philippines' just energy transition, the project and financial pledges cover the development of 222 MW of OffShore Wind, 1,028 MW of Solar and 0.5 MW Hydropower.

More local government units (LGUs) are declaring a climate emergency, crafting executive orders and ordinances to push their local jurisdictions to commit to 100 percent renewable energy. For a rapid, just energy transition, the LGUs have a significant role to play for the country's climate ambition; and it is about time that climate finance and technology are driven towards these demands.

For the major role it has played in the climate crisis, the World Bank must fulfill reparations for the current and historical sins being committed. By expanding the development of fossil fuel projects, despite the science raising the global alarm of the fast-closing window towards climate catastrophe, World Bank's profiteering against the planet and the people must have to be stopped.

In this seventh year since the filing of the Philippine communities' complaint against the World Bank's expansion of coal in the country, PMCJ demands the World Bank to stop the harm and deliver the remedies due to hundreds of thousands of people suffering from its investment! For its failure to provide remedies since the filing of the climate action suit, the World Bank has no purpose and reason to exist.

In defense of our common future for the planet and all the people, the World Bank must stop meddling in the climate and in the lives of the people. #StopTheHarm and #DeliverTheRemedies now!

PH tourism is flying high; bags more awards for best destinations

he Philippine tourism industry is flying high, with many of its destinations recognized with awards and citations.

The most recent is the results of a global ecommerce study that showed that the Philippines is among the top three best destinations for long-staying tourists. The study was conducted by Ubuy, one of the top international online shopping platforms. Evaluating over a hundred countries, the study found that the Philippines has an appeal for extended stays because of its affordability, cultural richness, safety, and travel convenience.

Early this month, the country bagged the Condé Nast Travelers 2024 Readers' Choice Awards for having four destinations in the Top 10 islands in Asia. The lifestyle travel magazine named Boracay, Palawan, Cebu and the Visayan Islands, and Siargao as among Asia's Top 10 islands. Boracay, with a score of 91.94, ranked third in the Asia list.

Globally, Boracay ranked ninth, while Palawan, Cebu and the Visayan Islands, and Siargao were sixth, eighth, and 10th places, respectively.

In September, the Philippines was recognized with eight awards at the 31st World Travel Awards (WTA) for 2024, as: Asia's Leading Beach Destination; Asia's Leading Dive Destination; Asia's Leading Island Destination; Asia's Leading Luxury Island Destination; Asia's Leading Marketing Campaign; Asia's Leading Tourist Attraction; Asia's Leading Wedding Destination; and Transformational Leader Award in Tourism Governance.

Last year, the Philippines bagged several awards at the 30th WTA, including the first Global Tourism Resilience award, which it shared with four other nations. The WTA was established in 1993 to acknowledge, reward, and celebrate excellence across all tourism industry sectors.

President Marcos credited the Filipinos for being the driving force behind the country's achievements in the tourism sector.

"Our endless coastlines, lush forests, white sand beaches, and rich biodiversity are a sig-





nificant contribution to the breathtaking wonders of the world—but none more so than—the happy disposition, genuine kindness, and heartfelt warmth of the Filipino people," President Marcos wrote in his Facebook account.

Tourism Secretary Christina Frasco shared the same view: "The Filipino people, with their innate warmth, resilience, and passion, are at the heart of Philippine tourism. They are the embodiment of the essence of our culture, the genuine smiles, the unparalleled service, and the authentic experiences that leave a lasting impression upon every traveler."

Secretary Frasco said the DOT "is determined to expand tourism opportunities further by focusing on quality and sustainable tourism, ensuring that every visitor will leave with a deeper appreciation for the beauty and diversity of our nation."




