Editorial

Sustainable development starts at grassroots

A vital meeting took place last week between United Nations Deputy Secretary General Amina Mohammed and Go Negosyo founder Joey Concepcion that gave impetus to the important contribution of micro, small and medium enterprises (MSMEs) in enabling the Philippines to achieve significant progress in attaining the UN's Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

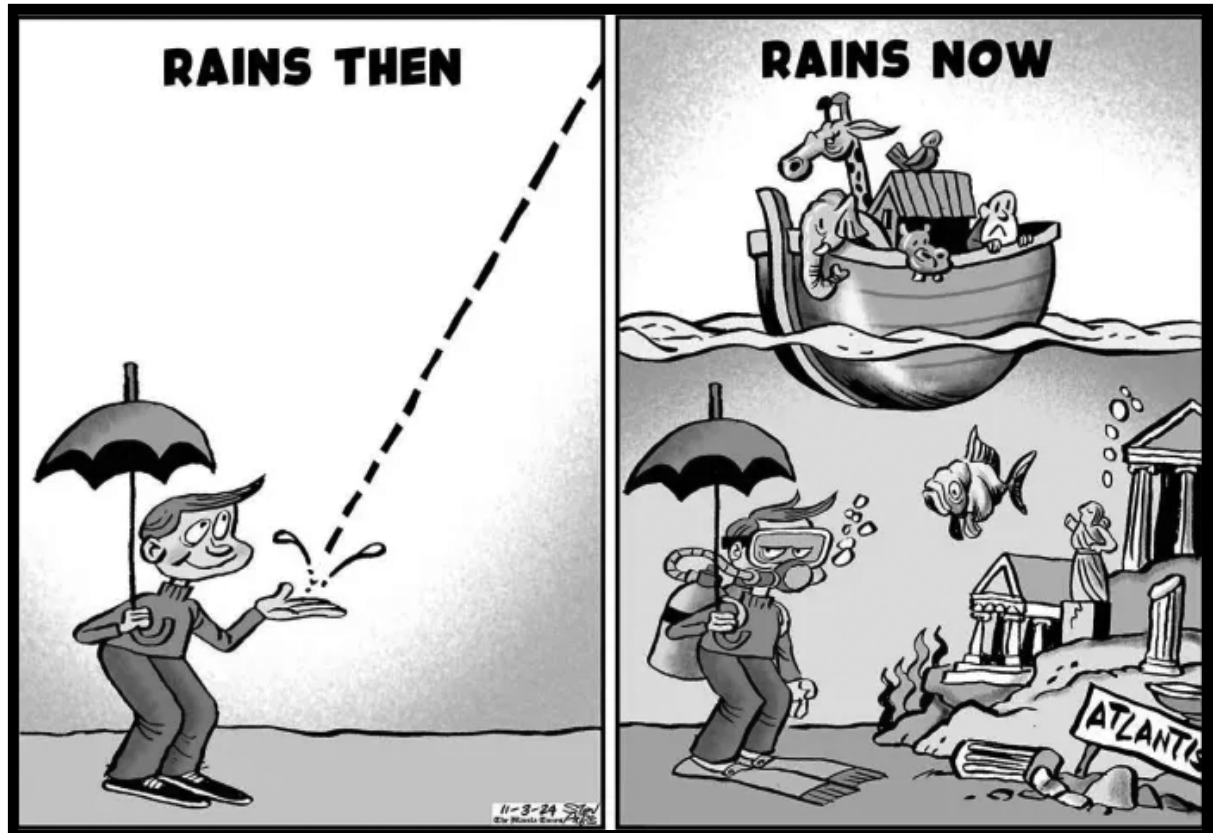
When MSMEs link up with social development and business organizations, they participate in accelerating the pace of economic progress. The nexus between economic growth and inclusive participation of the broad masses at the grassroots has been the focal point of the government's long- and medium-term development planning thrusts.

Corporate social responsibility (CSR) became a watchword when a wave of youth-led social ferment prompted leading corporations to establish the Philippine Business for Social Progress (PBSP) in 1970. Around 50 Filipino business leaders allocated one percent of their companies' net income before taxes for poverty reduction programs — the first such initiative in Asia — that was patterned after Venezuela's Dividendo Voluntario para la Comunidad (Voluntary Dividends for the Community).

PBSP's more than 260 corporate members support and operate nationwide programs in education, health, livelihood and the environment. Through P7 billion in grants and loans, the PBSP has assisted 6,200 development projects that have benefited 4.5 million Filipinos.

Two decades after PBSP's inception, the League of Corporate Foundations (LCF) was established as a grant-making network to fund community and social development projects. In 2010, the LCF co-founded the ASEAN CSR Network with the following organizations: ASEAN Foundation, Indonesia Business Links, International Chamber of Commerce-Malaysia, Singapore Compact for CSR, and the CSR Club of the Thai Listed Company Association.

With the propagation by the UN of its Mil-



lennium Development Goals (MDGs) from 2000 to 2015, and its adoption of the SDGs since then, leading global corporations, including those in the Philippines, have joined the Environmental, Social, and Governance (ESG) mainstream. ESG reporting has been adopted by companies that recognize the value of sustainability and responsible business practices.

Leading this initiative are publicly-listed corporations (PLCs). As mandated by the Securities and Exchange Commission in 2019, all PLCs that have a public float of at least 50 percent are already required to comply with and submit their annual ESG reports in accordance with the Global Reporting Initiative (GRI) standards. Medium to large companies and other PLCs that are not required to comply with the guidelines are still highly encouraged to do so voluntarily, as part of good business practice, and in order to promote mindfulness of social

responsibility across all areas of operations.

Three main areas of sustainability covered by ESG reporting are: impact on employees, customers, suppliers and the community; impact on the natural environment, such as its greenhouse gas emissions, waste generation and water usage; and commitment to human rights, labor standards, boardroom diversity, anti-corruption and bribery, executive compensation and corporate governance.

Exemplifying its commitment to end poverty and achieve sustainable development, the LCF has joined the nationwide movement to "prevent wasting and stunting, which can have dire and lasting consequences for afflicted children — as well as the Philippines as a whole — if they are not addressed."

Indeed, the endeavor to establish an inclusive and humane world starts at the grassroots.

8. Taho at tokwa – Ang soy products tulad ng taho at tokwa ay may sangkap na genistein, na maaaring makatulong sa pag-iwas sa breast cancer. Sa isang pagsusuri sa Asia, ang mga babaing malakas kumain ng taho at tokwa ay mas hindi tinatamaan ng breast cancer. Kaya, imbes na uminom ng gatas, puwede kang mag-soya milk. Ang tokwa at sabaw sa miso ay mabisa din. Gayahin niyo ako na mahilig kumain sa vegetarian food (tulad ng Bodhi fastfood). Ang vegemeat ay gawa din sa masustansyang tokwa.

9. Shitake mushrooms na nabibili sa palengke - Ang Shitake mushroom ay may polysaccharides at lentinian, na nagpapalakas sa ating immune system (katawan). Kapag malakas ang ating immune system, mas hindi tayo magkakasakit. Sa Japan, ang mga pasyeteng nag-che-chemotherapy ay pinapakain ng Shitake mushrooms para bumilis ang kanilang

paggaling.

10. Matatabang isda – Ang mga oily fish tulad ng tuna, tamban, tilapia (3 T's), at sardines ay sagana sa omega-3 fatty acids. Makatutulong ito sa pagbawas ng pamamaga sa ugat at panlaban din sa kanser. Kapag mas maraming isda ang iyong kakainin (at babawasan ang karneng baboy at baka), mas hindi ka magkakaroon ng kanser.

11. Yoghurt at mga probiotics tulad ng Yakult – Ang pagkain ng yoghurt at pag-inom ng probiotics ay makatutulong sa pagpapadami ng good bacteria (ang lactobacillus) para sa ating tiyan. Gaganda ang ating pagdumi at makaiwas tayo sa kanser sa tiyan (colon cancer).

12. Strawberries, blueberries at cranberries – Ang mga ito ay may sangkap na ellagic acid at polyphenols, na tumutulong sa pagtanggali ng cancer cells sa katawan.

Tandaan, para makaiwas sa kanser, damihan po ang pagkain nitong 12 anti-cancer foods, at bawasan ang pagkain ng mga bad foods, tulad ng taba, karne, soft drinks at sitsirya. Good luck po!

PHP22.037 billion, higher by 122.79 percent or PHP12.146 billion from PHP9.891 billion.

The NEDA Board also approved the 65-month extension of the project's implementation period starting from April 2025 until September 2029, the PCO said, adding it has been adjusted from the original October 2019 to April 2024.

The PCO said the NEDA Board also gave its nod to the change in the scope of work, particularly the widening of diversion channels and additional drainage channels.

Another adjustment was a loan reallocation totaling JPY1.042 billion from consulting services (JPY 384 billion) and contingencies.

"I think maybe the detailed engineering had to compensate for weather changes. And then the housing, wala 'yung housing sa (the housing was not included in the) original estimate," Marcos said during the meeting, as quoted by the PCO.

"The cost will be increased. At least the local component will be increased from the original. That's the only thing that sticks out on the financial analysis. But it's still within the guidelines," he added.

As of Sept. 30, 2024, the CIA-FRIMP has an overall physical accomplishment of 44.21 percent, with negative slippage of 55.79 percent. It has a fund utilization rate of 35.42 percent, or PHP3.503 billion already disbursed.

The project aims to mitigate flood damage in the lower reach of San Juan River Basin and its adjacent Maalimango Creek Drainage Area in Cavite province.

The NEDA Board also approved a 74.32-percent increase or PHP24.599 billion in total project cost from PHP33.097 billion to PHP57.696 billion for the PMRCIP Phase IV, the PCO said.

The PCO added there will be a 63-month extension for the implementation of

the PMRCIP Phase IV from December 2025 to March 2031.

The NEDA Board also approved the changes in scope of work, such as the design of the Middle Marikina River, modifications in drainage facilities, and additional work.

A loan reallocation totaling JPY3.373 billion from consulting services (JPY1.728 billion) and contingencies (JPY1.645 billion) to the civil works component was also approved by the NEDA Board, including a supplemental loan of JPY45.759 billion.

The PMRCIP aims to mitigate flood damage in Metro Manila caused by channel overflow of the Pasig-Marikina River.

The project is seen to benefit residents of the cities of Pasig, Marikina, and Quezon in Metro Manila and the municipalities of Taytay and Cainta in Rizal.

"Ang concern ko rin (My other concern) is the design. Does it take into account the new weather? Because ano na 'yan, danger area na 'yang Marikina talaga (The danger area is really in Marikina). The levels of water in the last two big typhoons we had, we came to within half a meter of the limit bago mag spillover," Marcos said.

Public Works and Highways Secretary Manuel Bonoan told Marcos that the design of the project helped in stopping spillover during the recent typhoons.

"The other component that we are looking into the Pasig-Marikina River is actually the construction of the three dams in the [watershed]," Bonoan said.

Apart from the changes in the two flood control projects, the NEDA Board also approved the implementation of the locally financed Philippine International Exhibition Center Project, and the acquisition of 40 units of fast patrol crafts to be funded through official development assistance (ODA). LRT-1 Cavite Extension to open 5 new stations this November

Here's a bit of good news for commuters in the Southern part of Metro Manila, five stations of the LRT-1 Cavite Extension are set to open later this month, the Department of Transportation said on Thursday.



Transportation Secretary Jaime Bautista said the five stations make up Phase 1 of the project. These are:

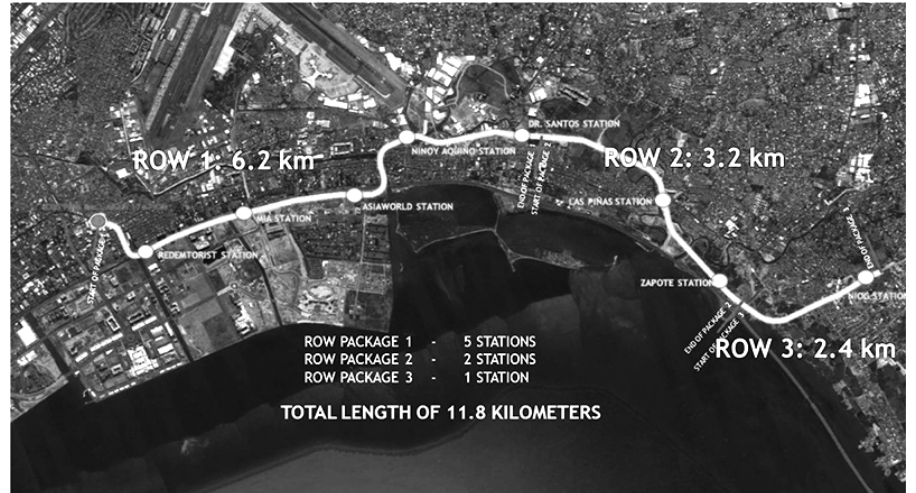
1. Redemptorist Station
2. MIA Station
3. Asia World (PITX) Station

4. Ninoy Aquino Station
5. Dr. Santos (Sucat) Station

"And we will open this line within the next maybe two to three weeks. This is within November. This will be the first railway project to be

completed within the administration of President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr." Bautista said during a press briefing.

Light Rail Manila Corp, the private operator of the LRT-1, said the five new stations extend the

railway's alignment by another 6 kilometers, making it 26 kilometers in total.

"This will allow people to traverse the alignment within a span of less than an hour," said LRMCC President and CEO Enrico Benipayo.

The LRT-1 currently runs from FPJ Station (formerly Roosevelt) in Quezon City to Baclaran Station in Pasay. Benipayo said the new stations are expected to boost the ridership of the country's first mass trans-

port system by 80,000 daily.

The LRT-1 ferries around 320,000 passengers daily. The new stations are expected to bump this up to 400,000 daily, but LRMCC said they also expect to further increase this to around 650,000 by 2028 or 2029. Benipayo added that this will benefit the economies of the surrounding areas.

"We cannot give you an estimate yet of how much more or less is the economic benefit. But one thing for sure is that

the travel time will be reduced. Easily, this can be reduced by 30 minutes from Baclaran to Santos Avenue," Benipayo said.

Phase 2 of the LRT-1 Cavite Extension project will be the opening of the Las Piñas and Zapote Stations, with Phase 3 being the Niog Station in Bacoor, Cavite. The government has not yet announced a timeline for the opening of these stations. - **With a report from Pia Gutierrez, ABS-CBN News**
