SARAI Ilocos Transforms Local Planning Through Stakeholder Engagement

The Department of Science & Technology Ilocos Region (DOST Ilocos Region), through its Smart Agriculture for Resilient Agriculture-based Innovations (SARAI) unit, continues to strengthen the foundation for data-driven agricultural development through a series of Technology Needs Assessment (TNA) and planning workshops conducted with partner local government units (LGUs) across the region.

The workshops were held in three key cities, each attended by local farmers and representatives from the City Agriculture Office headed by their respective City Agriculturists along with their Agriculture Extension Workers:

- * City of San Fernando – October 29, 2025
- * City of Batac – November 5, 2025
- * City of Candon – November 6, 2025

The activity served as a platform for gathering and validating on-the-ground agricultural data, including cropping calendars, yield patterns, challenges, and ongoing programs and projects

of the LGUs. By examining this information directly with the stakeholders who manage and experience local agricultural conditions daily, SARAI ensures that the next steps of its implementation reflect real needs and localized realities.

Participants openly discussed climate concerns, market pressures, crop performance issues, and conditions affecting productivity. The SARAI Ilocos team, in turn, presented the digital tools, applications, and decision-support systems of the project, demonstrating how satellite data, analytics, and



mobile-based advisories can support better planning, monitoring, and response at the field level.

Each session concluded with a planning workshop where validated data and shared insights were compiled to identify priority needs and areas where SARAI technologies can immediately create impact. These outputs now serve as the groundwork

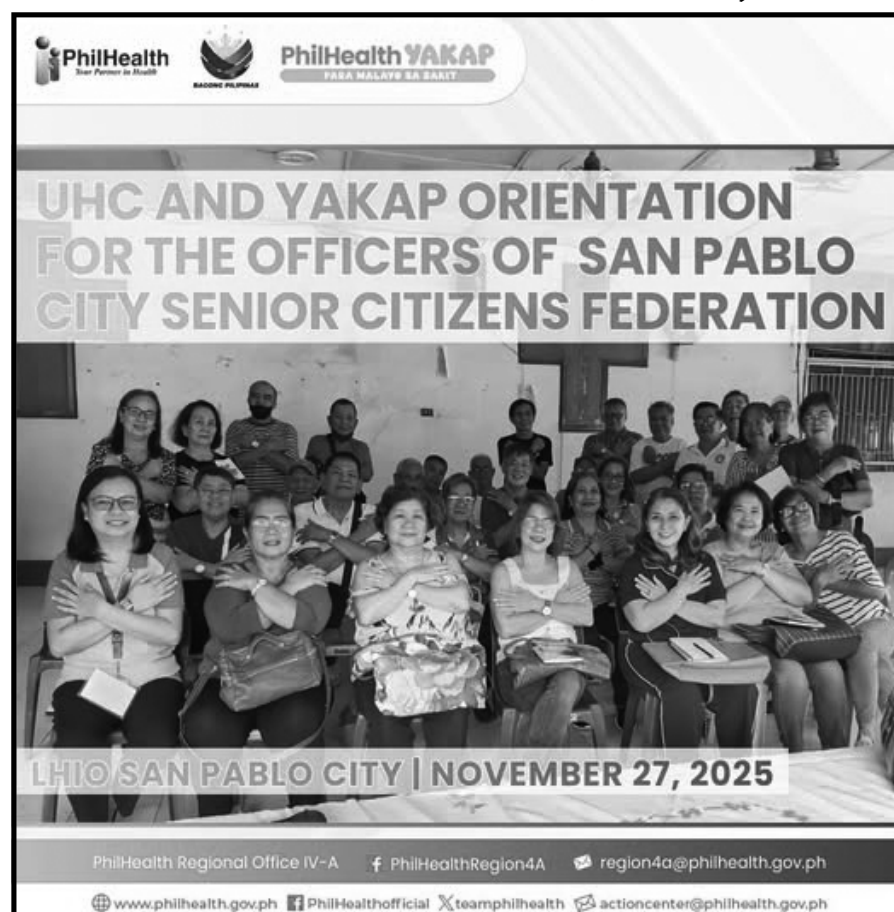

Editorial

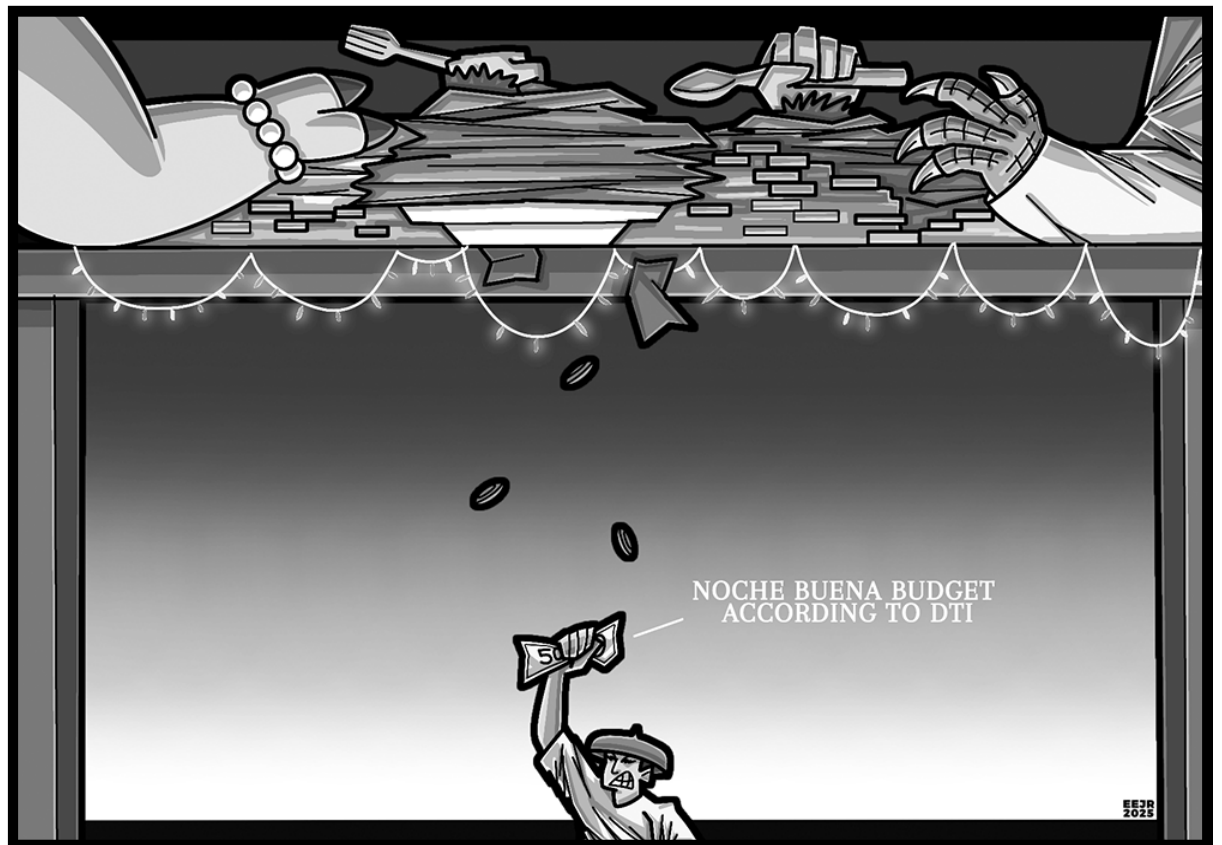
Environmental investment as an anti-corruption tool

ACCORDING to a recent commentary by the Asian Development Bank's (ADB) top economists, an overlooked area for significant economic growth among countries in Asia and the Pacific is in environmental conservation. This is not news; numerous studies and policy analyzes from a variety of sources over the past 30 years have reached the same conclusion. However, our recent weather disasters here in the Philippines, along with the ongoing crisis over corrupted and failed flood control and other public works projects, perhaps add a new imperative for the government to look more closely at maximizing nature-based economic drivers.

Most people are likely unaware of just how important ecosystems are to the economy in Asia-Pacific countries, including this one. Region-wide, about 75 percent of gross domestic product (GDP) is attributable to sectors that depend directly on nature. These primarily include agriculture, fisheries, forestry and tourism. In the Philippines, those sectors combined account for approximately 55 percent of direct and indirect employment, and at least 30 percent of GDP. This is a massive contribution to the country's productivity, fiscal stability and trade, making the preservation and maintenance of the natural systems that support it critically important.

The ADB experts said that "a global shift toward development that restores and protects nature could unlock more than \$10 trillion in business value and create 400 million jobs by 2030. Asia and the Pacific could capture \$4 trillion of this value and 232 million of these jobs." At first glance, these seem like too-good-to-be-true numbers, but some deeper examination reveals they are probably realistic, best-case scenarios though they may be.

First, we can consider the enormous cost of not protecting the environment, something that was made painfully clear, once again, by the recent calamities of typhoons Tino and Uwan. Agricultural losses alone, at last report, are in excess of P6 billion, and the direct damage to infrastructure and housing in the affected areas likely exceeds that. Huge costs are incurred in disaster response and recovery, and there are knock-on effects that are almost never calculated, such as the loss of business revenues, consumer spending and the multiplier effect one calamity has on the next, as the degraded environment and infrastructure makes the impact worse. We have seen this to some extent with flooding and other storm damage caused



by the much less Severe Tropical Storm Verbera this week hitting areas in the Visayas that have not yet fully recovered from Tino.

In the context of the flood control scandal, which the public has understandably correctly associated with the extreme damage and human toll from the storms in places like Cebu, nature-based infrastructure provides a substantial partial solution. ADB estimates that the same services as dams, floodwalls and drainage systems can be provided by natural infrastructure such as wetlands, mangroves, forests and coral reefs at about half the cost of built infrastructure, saving as much as \$248 billion a year across the Asia-Pacific in weather-related losses and development costs. Some of these natural developments can also provide added value as carbon sinks, creating additional jobs and revenue streams for host communities. Likewise, natural areas are lucrative tourist features, something which we in the Philippines have long recognized, but have largely failed to capitalize on due to a lack of strong policy attention. Other ways in which "natural infrastructure" can be monetized are environmental service payments for maintaining natural areas, green bonds, conservation grants or fiscal incentives.

The idea also provides one sure-fire solution to the pernicious problem of corruption in public works projects. There is little opportunity for thieving government functionaries, legislators and contractors to embezzle public funds for flood control infrastructure that can be created in a matter of days by community volunteers, functions primarily by simply leaving it alone, and is self-repairing.

Obviously, it is not a solution that can be substituted everywhere an artificial flood control system might be applied, such as in heavily congested urban areas where restoring the natural landscape would displace too many people. But applying natural solutions wherever possible reduces the need for built infrastructure, and along with it, reduces the risk of malfeasance by narrowing the scope of what has to be managed and monitored. Natural infrastructure also helps to improve the effectiveness and prolong the life of built infrastructure by absorbing some of the load of storm surges and floodwaters.

Treating the environment as the economic driver it actually is offers a wide range of benefits, and almost no drawbacks. It is high time it is taken seriously by our policymakers.

tone for the day. Undersecretary Leah J. Buendia emphasized the importance of integrated expertise and collaboration in shaping the country's national research priorities, a reminder that R&D grows when programs work in harmony rather than in isolation. This was echoed by DOST Secretary Renato U. Solidum Jr., who described scientific discovery as something rooted in curiosity but made impactful when turned into solutions for real societal needs. His message underscored the unique contributions of the Balik Scientist Program and the S&T Fellows Program, both of which expand technical expertise and provide vital support across regions.

Much of the program's heart continued through interactive sessions such as "Challenges ni Kuya" and "Nomination/Big Night ni Kuya." These activities encouraged participants to work together on scenario-based tasks that mirrored real challenges in science and technology. In these moments, team-

work and idea-sharing came naturally, revealing how collaboration strengthens R&D by allowing individuals to combine perspectives, test solutions, and approach problems with shared creativity. The energy in the room demonstrated that research becomes more meaningful when sparked by collective effort.

The activity concluded with the awarding of certificates, group photos, and networking moments that felt warm and hopeful. In his closing message, Undersecretary Teodoro M. Gatchalian encouraged continued partnerships and R&D efforts that uplift communities, reinforcing the day's core message: that progress grows when people commit to working together. As participants left the venue, the strengthened linkages, shared insights, and new collaborations formed during the activity became quiet but powerful steps toward a more connected and impactful research landscape for the regions and the nation. **(Daisy Rose S. Cuadra, Officer-in-Charge of the Office of the Provincial Cooperatives Development Officer (OPCDO), who emphasized the importance of unified direction and strong inter-cooperative collaboration to meet the evolving needs of communities.

Delivering the keynote address was Asst. Director Bernadette Preciosa Hornilla, Assistant Regional Director of CDA Region IV-A. Speaking in a broad and compelling narrative, she underscored the indispensable role of cooperatives in uplifting local economies and enhancing social resilience. She highlighted the need for leadership that is adaptable, grounded in good governance, and responsive to emerging challenges. DOST Undersecretary for Regional Operations Engr. Sancho A. Maborang followed with an introduction of the Department's ILAW Framework for Smart and Sustainable Communities, which stands for Inclusive economies, Learning governance, Adaptive and regenerative planet, and Well-being of people and communities. He described the framework as a strategic guide for local development in the region.
