Tens of thousands expected to lineup for Nazareno image 'pahalik'

Tens of thousands of devotees are expected to line up for the pahalik, an old tradition that allows the faithful to venerate the revered image of Jesus Nazareno, organizers said.

Quiapo Church technical adviser Alex Irasga said the turnout is expected to be comparable to previous years for the devotional practice, in which devotees express reverence by kissing and touching the image.

"The number is very fluid... but it's always in the thousands (of devotees)," Irasga said.

The pahalik is set to begin at 7 p.m. Wednesday at the Quirino Grandstand, following a 6 p.m. Mass for volunteers. The activity will run continuously until Jan. 9, ahead of the grand procession marking the Feast of Jesus Nazareno.



CHR is off the mark on call for PhilHealth funds 'accountability'

OVER the weekend, Commission on Human Rights (CHR) Chairman Richard Palpal-latoc sounded off on the now-resolved controversy over the transfer of P60 billion in Philippine Health Insurance Corp. (PhilHealth) funds to the national treasury, saying that the government officials responsible for it "must be held liable." This followed earlier, and equally baseless, accusations of malfeasance from some quarters, and is yet another example of this country's unfortunate and unproductive preference to seek villains instead of real accountability when such controversies arise. It is particularly irresponsible in this case, as Palpal-latoc is a government official who should know better, and if he did not, could have informed himself with a few minutes of basic research.

To recap the chain of events, the transfer of funds from PhilHealth began with then-Albay representative Joey Salceda's revelation in 2023 that the state-run insurance fund had P203 billion in excess funds, and that other government-owned and controlled corporations (GOCCs) also had "idle funds." That eventually resulted in the passage of HB 9513 by the House, an act authorizing the use of excess GOCC funds for unprogrammed appropriations, but of course, those appropriations that would still require the approval of Congress as part of the annual budget bill. HB 9513 or a counterpart bill did not advance in the Senate, but the matter was handled by Congress' inclusion of a Special Provision 1(d) under Chapter XIII (Unprogrammed Appropriations) of the 2024 General Appropriations Act. That provision allowed the use of GOCC funds "from any remainder resulting from the review and reduction of their reserve funds to reasonable levels, taking into account the disbursement from prior years, and consistent with pertinent laws and regulations." It then directed the Department of Finance (DOF) to issue guidelines within 15 days to implement this provision.

The DOF did this with Circular 003-2024, which covered all GOCCs, and then took the necessary steps to identify the applicable amounts and direct their transfer to the Treasury. PhilHealth's useable excess was tagged at P89.9 billion, considerably pared down from the P203 billion identified by Salceda. A total of P60 billion had been transferred, in several tranches, before the Supreme Court put the brakes on it last month by declaring Special Pro-



vision 1(d) and Circular 003-2024 unconstitutional and violative of the Universal Health Care Act (RA 11223).

Contrary to what Palpal-latoc and other critics desperately searching for scapegoats in a matter that has been effectively resolved, from beginning to end the PhilHealth fund transfer was handled according to proper legal process. Congress passed the provision authorizing it, and directed the DOF to implement it. Before any funds moved from PhilHealth according to these instructions, they first had to be approved by the PhilHealth board, and cleared by the Office of the Solicitor General (OSG), the Office of the Government Corporate Counsel (OGCC), the Governance Commission for GOCCs (GCG), and the Commission on Audit (COA). The Supreme Court ruling striking down the fund transfer was part of the process, too, one that the administration has accepted and is now taking the needed steps to comply with.

So, who, exactly, should be "held liable?" Granted, the subject of excess funds at PhilHealth was controversial from the moment Salceda first raised the issue, with questions being asked about how those

funds accumulated in the first place. Critics have made the assumption these were funds from PhilHealth members' contributions. PhilHealth for its part has consistently maintained that they were not, but rather unused government subsidies and investment returns. With its ruling last month, the Supreme Court made the issue moot by emphasizing that under the Universal Health Care Act, all PhilHealth funds regardless of their provenance, are restricted to use for the provision of health care.

The only possible villains in all this are the entire 19th Congress, who crafted and passed the law that authorized the fund transfer in the first place. As Congress represents the people, that is a ridiculous notion; thus, the real fault lies in a process. And unfortunately, fixing a faulty process is not as easy, and does not bait the public's outrage as much as simply suggesting that some person or persons are to blame. There are many critical issues that need the expert attention of the CHR and its leadership. The PhilHealth fund transfer matter is not one of them.

Schneider Electric Powers All Cavite Facilities With 100% Renewable Energy Through Partnership With ACEN RES

American Power Conversion (APC) by Schneider Electric, a global leader in uninterruptible power supply systems and data center infrastructure, has transitioned all five of its manufacturing facilities in the Cavite Economic Zone to run entirely on renewable energy. This marks a major sustainability milestone for the company and reinforces its long-term commitment to reducing carbon emissions across its global operations.



The achievement was made possible through a renewable energy supply agreement with ACEN RES, the retail electricity supplier of the Ayala Group. The arrangement was established under the Philippine government's Green Energy Option Program (GEOP), which enables qualified electricity consumers to choose renewable energy as their

primary power source. The GEOP, created by the Department of Energy, allows organizations with an average monthly electricity consumption of at least 100 kilowatts to directly contract renewable energy providers rather than relying on traditional distribution utilities. This mechanism supports businesses in advancing their sustainability objec-

tives and accelerating the country's clean energy transition. ACEN RES currently leads the green energy supply market under GEOP, holding a 57 percent share. Schneider Electric's five Cavite facilities—primarily involved in semiconductor manufacturing—began operating on 100 percent renewable energy in December 2025. The

ATI Calabarzon training program to focus on 'modernizing' agriculture

CALAMBA CITY, Laguna (PIA) – The Department of Agriculture's Agricultural Training Institute (DA-ATI) in CALABARZON will prioritize providing responsive training aimed at modernizing local farming and fishing practices in 2026.

Dr. Rolando Maningas, Center Director for ATI CALABARZON, emphasized that the center will also focus on inclusive and technology and skills-based training.

"We will solidify our efforts to modernize and mechanize the agri-fishery sector by reinforcing technologies, innovations, quality extension services, inclusivity, and skills-based training that respond to the evolving needs of our farmers and fishers," he said.

As the training hub for farmers, fisherfolk, Agri-

culture Extension Workers (AEWs), as well as hobbyists and enthusiasts, Maningas also noted that the region's programs integrated modern technology and sustainable farming practices to create a resilient agriculture sector.

Training and other extension initiatives by the DA-ATI CALABARZON primarily focused on good agricultural practices, farm mechanization, climate-resilient agriculture, smart farming, and integrated nutrient and pest management,"

he added.

Maningas underscored that training for agricultural workers goes beyond production—it also hopes to transform the region's strengths in agribusiness.

"The agency also provided technologies along the agricultural value chain, including post-harvest technologies, processing, and marketing—across different banner programs."

This effort will focus on key programs, including rice, corn, livestock, Coconut Farmers and In-



dustry Development Plan (CFIDP), High Value Crops Development Program (HVCDP), organic agriculture, and National Urban and Peri-urban Agriculture Program

(NUPAP).

In 2025 alone, the ATI CALABARZON has equipped over 4,783 farmers; 1,209 agricultural extension workers (AEWs) from various lo-

Taiwan community flag-raising in Cavite signals deeper bilateral ties

THE Taiwanese business and overseas community in the Philippines marked the New Year with a flag-raising ceremony in Carmona City, Cavite, symbolizing the steady advancement of relations between Taiwan and the Philippines.



Organized by the Taiwanese Chamber of the South Philippines (TCSPI) on January 1, the gathering at the TCSPI clubhouse drew approximately 200 participants. The event brought together prominent business leaders, volunteers from Taiwan's Overseas Community Affairs Council (OCAC), and representatives from the Taipei Economic and Cultural Office (TECO) in the Philippines to celebrate the new year.

Taiwan's Representative to the Philippines, Ambassador Wallace M. G. Chow, lauded the

event as a reflection of the strengthening bond between the two neighbors. He cited 2025 as a milestone year, pointing to increased official exchanges, the implementation of visa-free entry for Taiwanese travelers, and impactful trade and investment missions to hubs like Subic, Clark, and Metro Manila.

VATICAN—More than 33.4 million pilgrims traveled to Rome to participate in the Jubilee of Hope, surpassing initial projections, the Vatican said Monday.

Archbishop Rino Fisichella, pro-prefect of the Dicastery for Evangelization, said 33,475,369 pilgrims ultimately took part in the Jubilee — nearly 2 million more than the Vatican's initial estimate of 31.7 million.

He also said the final group to pass through the Holy Door on Monday will be staff from the Dicastery for Evangelization, the principal organizers of the Holy Year, at 5:30 p.m. local time.

The solemn closing of the Holy Year will take place Tuesday at 9:30 a.m. local time, when Pope Leo XIV is scheduled to close the Holy Door of St. Peter's Basilica in a ceremony expected to be attended by Italian President Sergio Mattarella, civil authorities, and large numbers of faithful.

The Holy Door is scheduled to be opened again in eight years, in 2033, for the Jubilee of the Redemption.

In his assessment of the Jubilee, Fisichella described the year as extraordinary in many respects and noted its unusual historical arc: The Jubilee began under Pope Francis and concludes under Pope Leo XIV — a transition he said underscored the complexity of the organizational effort.

He also pointed to major events that unfolded alongside the Jubilee calendar, including the funeral of Pope Francis on April 26 and the election of his successor, Leo XIV, on May 8, saying those developments were integrated into the Jubilee schedule amid an exceptional succession of events.

Pilgrims from 185 countries

According to official Vatican data presented Monday, pilgrims from

185 countries took part in Jubilee events. By geographic area, Europe accounted for 62.63% of participants, followed by North America (16.54%), South America (9.44%), and Asia (7.69%). The remaining pilgrims came from Oceania (1.14%), Central America and the Caribbean (1.04%), Africa (0.95%), and the Middle East (0.46%).

By country, Italy represented 36.34% of pilgrims, followed by the United States (12.57%) and Spain (6.23%). Other leading countries included Brazil (4.67%), Poland (3.69%), Germany (3.16%), the United Kingdom (2.81%), China (2.79%), Mexico (2.37%), and France (2.31%). The Vatican also recorded significant participation from Argentina, Canada, Portugal, Colombia, Australia, the Philippines, Slovakia, Indonesia, and Austria.

Fisichella said that beginning in May — around the time of Leo XIV's election — Rome saw an unexpected increase in pilgrims, which he said was managed with close attention in a city that remained under international media focus throughout the year.

How the count was made

Fisichella said the initial projections were based on a study by the Faculty of Sociology at Roma Tre University and were intended as an early planning guide.

He said the primary count was made at St. Peter's Basilica's Holy Door, where a camera automatically recorded the number of pilgrims passing through each day.

For the other three papal basilicas — St. John Lateran, St. Mary Major, and St. Paul Outside the Walls — the Vatican ap-

Pope Leo XIV closes St. Peter's Holy Door, concluding Jubilee of Hope

VATICAN—Pope Leo XIV on Tuesday closed the Holy Door of St. Peter's Basilica, bringing the ordinary Holy Year to an end — a time of grace that invited Catholics to conversion, reconciliation, and hope.

The pontiff processed toward the Holy Door as the antiphon *O clavis David* was sung. Reaching the threshold, he knelt before the door and remained for a few minutes in silent prayer. He then rose and, at 9:41 a.m., pushed shut the two large bronze doors — a gesture that visibly marked the end of the jubilee season.

"With thankful hearts we now prepare to close this Holy Door, crossed by a multitude of faithful, certain that the Good Shepherd always keeps the door of his heart open to welcome us whenever we feel weary and oppressed," Leo XIV said in an address before the concluding gesture that ended the ecclesial event, ordinarily held every 25 years to offer the faithful the possibility of obtaining a plenary indulgence.

With these words, Leo XIV emphasized that

even though the Jubilee has ended, God's mercy remains ever open to believers.

Before closing the doors, the Holy Father pronounced in Latin the formula prescribed by the rite, following a practice established in 1975 and later simplified by St. John Paul II during the Jubilee of the Year 2000.

In keeping with the simplified celebration, the public rite did not include the portion involving the construction of a brick wall and was limited to the closing of the bronze doors. The masonry work itself will be carried out later, privately, about 10 days after this public rite.

The act will be overseen by the Office of Liturgical Celebrations of the Supreme Pontiff. The so-called sampietrini — personnel of the Fabric of St. Peter, including carpenters, cabinetmakers, and electricians who nor-

During this private rite — without cameras or journalists — the traditional metal capsule (capsis) will be inserted into the wall. It will contain the official act of closure, coins minted during the jubilee year, and the keys of the Holy Door, as a material and symbolic testimony of the Holy Year that, as the pope noted, has ended on the calendar but not in the spiritual life of the Church.

Leo XIV then recited the prayer of thanksgiving for the ordinary Holy Year, proclaiming: "This Holy Door is closed, but the door of your mercy is not closed."

The formula concluded with an invocation that the "treasures" of divine grace would remain open "so that, at the end of our

administrations.

Gualtieri said the Jubilee program included 332 interventions, with 204 already completed or partially completed. He added that street works in Rome were about 90% finished, with the remaining 10% scheduled for completion in 2026.

The Jubilee of Hope was instituted on Dec. 24, 2024, by Pope Francis but, after his death in April, was concluded by his successor, Leo XIV — a situation not seen since the year 1700. The last ordinary Jubilee (celebrated every 25 years) took place in 2000.

Jubilees may also be celebrated at "extraordinary" moments, such as the Jubilee of Mercy celebrated by Francis in 2015, or the one to be convoked in 2033 to commemorate the two millennia of the death and resurrection of Jesus.

After closing the Holy Door, Leo XIV presided over Mass for the solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord inside St. Peter's Basilica, bringing the day's liturgical celebration to its conclusion.

ment funding specifically allocated for Jubilee-related works totaled 1.725 billion euros. According to Gualtieri, 75% of those resources were used for interventions completed or partially completed, while spending for essential, non-deferrable interventions reached 90%.


